Instructions:

1. **Students must file a graduation-application with the CSU-Pueblo Records Office no later than the third week of the semester (Fall or Spring) preceding the graduating term.**
2. The graduation-planning sheet should be completed by the major/minor academic advisor(s) and the student using a copy of the student's transcript. Masters degree students need only complete the sections applicable to their degree.
3. The planning sheet should be signed by the student, the student's advisor(s), the department chair or the college dean. NOTE: The same person may not sign in two places.
4. The Records Office will audit the accuracy of the planning sheet and notify the student by mail.

- Specific listed courses will be audited exactly; other courses can be shown as general electives (upper or lower).
- Check for repeated courses that have not been recomputed. These credits will have an effect on the total hours earned.



- Commencement exercises take place once a year. The commencement ceremony is held at the end of each spring semester.
 - These students are eligible to participate:
 - ✓ Those who completed degree requirements in the previous fall semester
 - ✓ Those who are scheduled to complete degree requirements in the spring semester
 - ✓ Those who will complete degree requirements in the summer session following the commencement ceremony.
 - ✓ All accounts with CSU-Pueblo must be settled before a diploma or an official transcript will be released.
